Resurrection for right now



Queen once had a song I loved called 'I want it all'. The lyrics said 'I want it all, and I want it now!' I'm a bit like that – impatient I know. My mother always used to say to me 'you'll have to wait', but it was so frustrating!

One of the things that saddens me about the amazing Easter message of resurrection is that we

can think of it as something that 'we'll have to wait' to benefit from. The victory of Jesus over death and sin means that one day, when we die, we too will rise to new life. And whilst I believe that's true, it's really not enough for me!

Because I reckon Jesus wants us, in the words of Queen, to *have it all, and have it now!* I don't believe we need to wait till we die to experience Resurrection. It isn't reduced to some distant event. It's something we can embody right now, in our everyday connection with God.

Resurrection happens each time we choose love over hate or resentment. When we refuse negativity but decide affirmation instead, we are living new life! Every time we choose to trust and start again – even after failure - is a resurrection moment. Each time we fail to resign ourselves to helplessness and instead choose hope, we



encounter the transformative power of the risen Christ. We don't need to wait! We can be resurrection people right now!

Every time we reach out and help – even when we needn't; Every time we value one another instead of putting each other down; Every time we lift each other up – we, like Jesus, show that love wins, the enemy is defeated, and a new life is possible.

The resurrection wasn't just a solitary miracle performed by Jesus; it's the very essence of a new world, bursting with grace, potential, and renewal. It's not a victory unique to Jesus, but a narrative that you and I are invited to participate and join in with. It's boundless and abundant – that's why Jesus calls it 'life in all



its fullness'. And everyone, without exception, is welcomed into this boundless wellspring of divine love, and possibility, and new life.

Resurrection – we can all have it, and we can have it all! It's up to us to choose to embody it, and to be channels of its transformative power for others too.

So, may we choose life – resurrected life, and live it now!
