The Lord is my Binman

How do you get rid of the rubbish in your life: the deep pain and hurts that others may have inflicted, the guilt and the shame of our own past mistakes, the bitterness and hurt of unforgiven wrongs?

Stanley Spencer is famous for reimagining Biblical stories and setting them in his hometown of Cookham. Here's a painting I saw again in Newcastle, last month.

In the centre of this scene a binman comes home after a long day's hard work.

He's still wearing his work clothes: corduroy trousers with string tied below the knees, presumably to stop rats running up the leg. Two other binmen stand behind to the right, one with his hands under his braces. The binman has got a very warm welcome home from his wife, as she picks him up in her arms and embraces him. It's a bit reminiscent of a bridegroom carrying his new wife across the threshold, but here the tables are turned. The strong wife carries her husband. Spencer, himself, compared this scene to The Resurrection on the Last Day, when the dead will be raised. What kind of a welcome home will we receive when we reach our heavenly home, and the bride and groom (The Church and Christ) are re-united?

This painting, though, has echoes of other paintings. There are plenty of artworks where Mary, the mother of Jesus, carries and holds up the infant Christ for the world to see. But, in Spencer's painting the three wise men have become three wise women. We can see the bins they've brought with them, and in place of a camel or two, a white cat stretches itself out in front of the fence. Instead of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, these three bring their treasures of a red tea pot, green cabbage top and a jam tin. I wonder what Spencer is suggesting here?

How are we to get rid of the rubbish in our lives? On the cross, all our guilt and shame are carried by Christ. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. The good news and promise of the Gospel is that if we are truly sorry and turn away from our faults and failures, then God is faithful and offers us forgiveness, healing and cleansing. The Lord is our binman!

But, are these really just pieces of rubbish that the three women are offering up, or are they in fact valuable treasures, like the Magi brought? The amazing thing about Jesus is that he can take our weaknesses and turn them into his opportunities. He can transform past failures into the chances to help and support others through similar trials. As another old song says: "If somehow you could pack up your sorrows and give them all to me, you would lose them; I know how to use them. Give them all to me."

And, of course, it is precisely those people who know their need of healing - who are broken and hurt, those rejected by society or treated like rubbish – these are the ones who are precious, treasured children in God's sight.

The Lord is not only my Binman who carries away the sins of the world, but my recycler and up-cycler, transforming what the world counts as useless rubbish, into items of value and worth, all to his glory.


