Aging

Finally, after several gentle reminders, I got around to putting up some of our son's wedding photos on the lounge wall. The photographer was excellent and made the most of what was less than ideal weather: the bride and groom and bridesmaids brimming with youth and vitality.

And there amongst them, a grey-haired dad with wrinkles around the smile and eyes. I'm



not complaining and many of you will consider me young or middle-aged (which taken literally you have to double to find out what old-age is).

This got me thinking about how we don't talk enough about aging as a church let alone as a society. We can too often fall into the trap of compartmentalising activities into age groups when in reality aging affects us all at exactly the same rate, one year at a time, so perhaps we should view it as another thing we have in common rather than something which sets us apart.

No one can really say when 'old age' begins and of course it's somewhat subjective: we all know or knew people who would never describe themselves as old and proving it by their attitude and love-of-life living.

I know an Anglican evangelist Ian Knox who, now in his mid-seventies, continues to visit Africa several times a year, to preach to thousands of people, visit schools and prisons, refresh and recommit local clergy and bishops to the task of sharing the Gospel. His 8-10 day itineraries are intense and I would find it difficult to keep up with a fraction of his schedule.

Ian is also an author and I enthusiastically commend his book 'Finishing Well' in which he explores the subject, full of anecdotes and Scripture, to give 'A God'seye view of aging'. There's a chapter titled 'Not retired - refired' and testimonies from people who have experienced significant spiritual growth in their later years: 'Every day I get re-converted', 'The Lord is teaching me new things...doing things in my inner life', to mention but two.

Here's a verse Ian finds hugely encouraging, which we should too: "Even to your old age and grey hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you" Isaiah 46:4

Easter Offering at Alston

On Sunday 30th June, people from congregations in the East of Eden Mission Community, Cumbria, made their way to the Town Hall in Alston (said to be the highest market town in England!) for the Easter Offering Service.

Over 50 people gathered, from Alston and from several small Fellside village churches, for a challenging and memorable service. Women and men from Anglican and Methodist congregations took part, with PowerPoint pictures accompanying readings, stories and hymns, - greatly enhancing the atmosphere of reflection and prayer. In remembering current places where there is injustice, reference was made to Argentina with whom both denominations are in partnership and where the courage of the church to fight for justice is exemplary. A chain of prayer was constructed accompanied by quiet music and was placed at the front for the prayers of intercession.

The offering amounted to £780 - all for Methodist World Mission.

Alston gave everyone a very warm welcome which included refreshments following the service.
