Road Works and Interruptions

Last Sunday we needed to travel from Skelton to the Hospital in Carlisle. We knew several roads were closed due to the building of the Southern Relief Road but thought we were avoiding such closures. We were wrong! We came to places where we could



not go and followed diversion signs using roads unfamiliar to us. Thankfully we did eventually reach our destination.



We all know of increased traffic on our roads in recent weeks and the many times we are delayed by traffic lights because of road works for many reasons. Because our normal straightforward journey is interrupted, it takes us much longer than we had hoped. Interruptions are not only on our roads but also in life generally. We might make plans to go places, meet

people, make visits but something unexpected happens and we are delayed or possibly cannot carry out the plans at all.

Jesus was no stranger to this. He was called upon to visit the home of Jairus to heal his sick daughter when the journey was interrupted by someone else who needed the help of Jesus. A woman in the crowd touched Jesus' cloak so that she might be healed and there were then conversations which took some time. This delay meant that the little girl had died but Jesus continued the journey so that she could be healed. Imagine the thoughts of Jairus who must have been very troubled by the delay.

Do we sit at the traffic lights getting more and more anxious and worried? There is nothing we can do until the lights turn green. Maybe we can learn lessons from these lights.

- The red light means STOP. Does God want us to stop for a little while? It may be to take a break from our busyness and take stock of where we are. The stopping gives us the chance to speak to Him again and allow Him to speak to us.
- The amber light means BE PREPARED. Again, a slight delay as we think of tasks ahead and allow the Holy Spirit to show us how we should think and speak and act.
- The green light means GO. Now it is safe to proceed and hopefully we do so with purpose knowing that the God who understands the interruptions is with us in the actions.



We can't control the traffic lights any more than we can change the things that interrupt our lives, but we can be assured that God is with us in all things and he knows best.

CARING FOR THE CARE STAFF and VOLUNTEERS OF CUMBRIA

Wellbeing retreats and time out days – free to Cumbrian care staff.

A collaborative project between the Sacred Space Foundation and the Diocese of Carlisle, an initiative of our former Bishop James and Rev. Prof. Stephen Wright of the Sacred Space Foundation and Honorary Fellow of the University of Cumbria.

During 2020-22 Our successful project provided peaceful rest and restorative retreats at the Diocesan Centre of Rydal Hall.

Focussing on the needs of care staff and volunteers from many different backgrounds (health, social, teaching, care home, police, ambulance....), we provided time out days and short stays at Rydal Hall for some 80 Cumbrian carers.

Thanks to the generosity of the people of Cumbria we are able to offer more quiet days this year – including a three-night residential retreat in September (23, 24,25) for 10 people, and a chance to rest and relax on a single time-out day on 14th October.

Both include time (all optional) for quietness and reflection, guided walks and teachings in meditation and relaxation – all in the beautiful and hospitable setting of Rydal Hall. Good food. Fresh air. And a chance to be taken care of for a change, rather than doing the caring.

Cost? Nothing to applicants, but we ask for a deposit which is fully refundable when you turn up.






