

# Weekly Bulletin Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> October Van Gogh

Here's a little-known fact that may surprise you.

Vincent Van Gogh was a Methodist Local Preacher.

Yes, it's true! Van Gogh was brought up as a child in a strict and austere Dutch Reformed Church family. Both his father and his grandfather were ordained pastors, and echoes of

the Bible stories he learnt as a child can often be traced in his famous paintings.

In 1876 he travelled to England and began teaching in a couple of schools, but by October that year he was working in a church in Isleworth as a lay pastor and "missioner", leading home groups and teaching in the Sunday School. On Sunday 29th October he preached his first sermon at Richmond Methodist Church, based on Psalm 119 verse 19: "I am a stranger on earth; hide not your commandments from me". With echoes from John Bunyan's The Pilgrim's Progress, his sermon sees himself as a pilgrim cut off from his family and his native country: "We are pilgrims, our life is a long walk or journey from earth to heaven". Despite his strong accent, he then preached again at Petersham Methodist Church on the evening of Sunday 19th November.

In December he decided to go home to Holland for the Christmas holidays. He wasn't in good health, physically or emotionally. One biographer says: "To his parents he appeared unwell, depressed, lonely and obsessed by religion. They advised him not to return to England and Vincent agreed."

For a while he lived back at his parent's house in Nuenen. His Father died in 1885, and this painting of his Father's Bible was produced about six months

later. Notice that the candle beside the Bible appears to have been snuffed out. It no longer sheds any light.

His Father's Bible is open (but hard to make out) at Isaiah 53. "For we like sheep have gone astray..." Next to the Bible (or indeed in front of it), is a battered, well-read copy of Emile Zola's "La Joie de Vivre" (Zest for Life), which Van Gogh apparently regarded as a kind of bible of modern life. (Personally, I've always found Zola's books quite depressing. I remember reading "The Beast in Man" once. Spoiler Alert... Everyone dies!)

The two books appear to symbolise the contrasting views on life held by father and son. Is this painting a tribute to his father? Or is it a rejection of his austere ways? Biblical puritanism with its laws and prohibitions, or the Joy of Life? Perhaps, however, as Van Gogh paints the two books together it isn't a straight choice of either/or. Perhaps it's a both/and.

You don't actually have to close the Bible to also pick up Emile Zola (or any other good novel!)

So, have you read any good books lately?

Tickets are £20 in advance or at the door (£5 for students)






## **Piano Looking for a New Home**

These will be taken to an orphanage and refugee centre in UKRAINE where they will be made into TRENCH CANDLES, which are used for light, heat and even cooking.




The soldiers also need (in good condition) socks, woolly hats and gloves. AND (NEW) toothbrushes, toothpaste and razors.

They need toys and clothes in good condition.








All items can be left in the blue box in reception.
