The Bigger Picture



This is the reflection I shared at last week's Woodland Collective with a few tweaks. I thought you might like to read it too. For best results, please read in a woodland:

l just want to invite you to look up at the tree canopy. What do

you notice about it? When looking up in a woodland, I'm reminded of how the different trees interact. Most of their branches rarely cross, preferring to grow where there's more light rather than competing for space. They are an individual ecosystem, a home for thousands of bugs, birds and squirrels.

And yet, they remain part of a bigger picture. Underneath our very feet is a network of mycelian connecting every living thing planted in this ground. They communicate with one another and even help heal one another. When there is disease, they know about it and can share nutrients with one another at critical times. Ecologist Suzanne Simard describes trees as 'social creatures'. Even when they fall and die, they put their nutrients back into the ground to help the younger trees and for decades after the dead wood continues to be a habitat for different life forms. Each tree has a part to play in the larger ecosystem around it. Sorry you may have noticed that I love trees...

Jesus was really good at drawing our attention to the bigger picture. Inviting us to focus on that which is greater than ourselves: the love we show all humanity. "Love your neighbour" (Mark 12:31).

It's easy in the world today, to focus on 'me' and 'my own'. 'What's best for me and my family? Me and my community. Me and my country.' Valid questions to ask except when it gets in the way of us showing love to others and forgetting the bigger picture. Whilst we are all individuals, we remain part of a bigger story. A bigger ecosystem. This often feels unordered and chaotic. Sometimes it's uncomfortable because we want to keep all our nutrients to ourselves. But I don't think that's what being part of this global ecosystem is all about. I think it's about playing our part, loving one another and respecting all. But don't let me tell you what to think. What does being part of a global ecosystem look like to you? How does it inform your interactions with the world?

PLEASE NOTE that we meet again on <u>Monday, December 9th.</u> This will be our Christmas get-together John & Margaret






Liz Crumlish

PLEASE HELP UKRAINE



Thank you to everyone for contributing to the humanitarian aid that we are collecting for Ukraine. Everything that you donate goes directly from us to the soldiers and to the orphanage and refugee centre. Steve, our contact in Odesa (who used to live in Cumbria), comes back to the UK every few months to load his 44-tonne lorry with aid, so nothing is too big or too small!

Some of the things that we need are:

- Candles preferably just plain wax ones, new or partly used (these are melted down and made into trench candles)
- Warm hats, gloves, socks and underwear for the soldiers, as well as toiletries, toothbrushes, toothpaste, paracetamol, razors and bandages.
- Chocolate, sweets and dried soup etc. that can be made into a meal by the addition of hot water. (These all need to have very long use-by dates.) To bring a little comfort to weary soldiers.
- Any items to help the wounded such as disability aids.
- Adult clothes, bedding (including clean duvets) and towels for the refugee centre.
- Boxes of washing powder for laundry. Female sanitary and hygiene products. Soap, shampoo and shower gel.
- Children's clothes and toys, as well as any equipment relating to children for the orphanage.

With your help we will let the brave people of Ukraine know that they are not alone.




Restore on the Road 2024–2026 and Beyond...

We have funds to invest in an electric van and we are looking for people to volunteer to be part of this project.






Can you be a...


