I am writing this in advance. By the time you read this (either via the email on Friday or later on paper) I shall be a year older. Actually it is only a day older than the day before but a birthday signifies a change in age.

We view Birthdays and ages differently depending on our stage of life. A young child wants to be older (the day after their 4th birthday

they say "I'm nearly 5!) Pre and early teens want to be grown up too quickly. In middle years we don't necessarily wish to disclose our age – 21 again!!. It is only as we grow much older that we own up and say "I'll be 70, or 75, or 80 next birthday." Do we celebrate these milestones in life? Perhaps not every year but significant birthdays call for something special. Our friends and family are invited to join us to mark the occasion. Amongst the laughter and sharing of food there will usually be reminiscing – "Do you remember when...."

When we think of our relationship with God do we want to celebrate? We take the opportunity to meet with others. We share food – meals, buffets, teas and coffees as well as in Communion Services and remember God's faithfulness over many years. It should be a time of encouragement to build each other up in the faith. Even though some of our life's experiences have been less than positive, God has not let us down.



Let us be thankful that God has brought us to NOW. He has loved us, guided us, forgiven us and renewed us through the power of the Holy Spirit. And what is so wonderful is that he promises to continue all these things into the future, however short or long that may be. We cannot but sing:


PMC Communal Christmas Card


