I've always loved the outdoors. Hiking on a fairly regular basis and enjoying all God's creation has to offer. But I've always looked at fell runners like they've got a screw loose. 'Why would you run up the side of a mountain in the middle of winter, wearing shorts and a t-shirt?' I'd often say. Me and my friend, Jack, always looked at those people and said 'never going to be us'.

However, this week I found myself attempting (with a strong emphasis on the word 'attempting') to run up the side of Seat Sandal in a pair of shorts and a fleece after Jack encouraged me to give it a go. And I loved it!

This isn't a story about how I encountered God on top of a hill I'm afraid. In fact, the only thing I encountered was a feeling of cold knees. But it got me and Jack talking about how things have changed in just a few years. How we as people have grown and evolved, and how we will continue to do so. How just a short time ago, neither of us would have attempted to do fell running and now we're both diving into it.

We've moved into the season advent. A time of waiting and anticipation (something I'm far from comfortable with). Yet sometimes we don't even know what we're waiting for, but we still feel God's got something in store. Sometimes we can't even comprehend how God is going to work in our lives. A great example of this is when the angel appeared to Mary and informed her she was going to give birth to the son of God, the one who would change the world. Up until then she had seen herself as the future wife of a carpenter. Now she saw the part she had to play in the bigger story. This must have been both exciting and terrifying!

You may doubt yourself. You may doubt what things God has in store for your life. You may even think there isn't anything more to come at the point of life you're at. But I would remind you to never say never. You have no idea where you will be a few weeks, months, or years from now or how God is going to work in your life. Let's leave ourselves open to what God is wanting to do in our hearts this advent season and see what wonders take place as a result.

UPDATE

Preparing for the Cumbria Circuit

The implantation Group have been hard at work during the autumn and are making good progress in both identifying the work required and making a start at gathering information.

An overall project plan has been developed against which progress will be monitored. The work has been divided into a number of areas mirroring the proposed functional structure of the new Circuit, Each Superintendent had been asked to initially lead one of the following groups:

- Strategy and Vision
- Mission
- Ministry
- Communication
- Governance and Legal
- Finance
- Central Support (Administration)
- Personnel
- Property

These groups consist of lay and ordained people from across the county who we feel have the appropriate skills – if however you'd like to get involved in any of the groups or have any queries, please contact Carolyn Dickinson who is providing administrative support to the Implementation Group carolyndickinson3@gmail.com or your local Superintentant.

The Groups meet both virtually and in person and refer back to the implementation group for advice and any decisions required. We want to involve as many people as possible, so over the next six months we will be consulting on important uses such as creating and owning a vision for the new circuit. We will also be asking the Spring Circuit Meetings to agree legal matters that will be required to progress the preparation. The intention is to have as much as possible in place for 1 September 2025.

A date for your diary is the formal welcome service for new ministers and a celebration of the start of the One Cumbria Circuit. This will be held on Sunday 31 August 2025 at 11am in Penrith Methodist Church followed by a lunch.

We are very conscious that this is a period of intense change and wish to ensure we communicate progress and provide further details on a regular basis. As well as monthly bulletins during 2025, after each Implementation group meeting, the Communications Group have been tasked with developing both interactive and more traditional methods of communication with the opportunity for feedback and discussion.

We pray for understanding and patience as we work through the establishment of this new and exciting phase of Methodism in Cumbria.




