Come, Lord Jesus!



Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. Matthew 24:42

Do you ever feel frustrated when things take too long or don't go the way you hoped?

The early Christians had a special prayer -"Maranatha!" It's Aramaic and means "Come, Lord Jesus!" They used it to express their longing for Jesus to come and make everything right - it's quoted several times in the New Testament.

We also use this prayer during Advent, a season where we look forward both to the

birth of Jesus in Bethlehem and also to the day when God will restore all of creation to perfection.

'*Come Lord Jesus*' acknowledges that what will be is not yet here – even though we want it! Perfect fulness as always still to come, and we do not need to demand it now. '*Come, Lord Jesus*' keeps life open to God's grace - and to a future created by God – in God's time - rather than ours.

This is also what it means to be awake. Advent is, above all else, a call to being attentive to God coming, and working in us and our world.

So often, we demand satisfaction and answers now - from one another, or from life working out on our terms. We are desperate for our expectations to be met and our dissatisfaction to be taken away.

But when we pray "Come, Lord Jesus," we're choosing to trust God instead of demanding our own way. It's an act of patient hope – a leap into a kind of freedom and surrender even when things feel unresolved. It helps us to live without closure, without resolution - and still be content, because our satisfaction is now at another level, and its source is beyond ourselves.

We are able to trust that God will come again, just as Jesus came as that baby in Bethlehem, and has come into our own past, and into our suffering world. Our experience of the past then becomes the prologue for our future, and *'Come, Lord Jesus'* isn't a cry of desperation, but rather an assured shout of cosmic hope.

The Homes for Ukraine system pays the host and this family can be housed separately (husband and wife separately from daughter). They are Christian on the evangelical side.
