Peace



If you look at the Christmas cards you have received so far, amongst them you may have some that carry the words 'Peace on Earth'. Perhaps, like me, you may be tempted to be slightly dismissive of such a naïve notion given the harsh realities of the world, but 'peace' is actually a significant theme of the New Testament and is at the heart of the Gospel message.

As I write this, I have Handel's Messiah playing through my headphones awaiting the chorus which quotes Isaiah's famous prophetic words in chapter 9 verse 6: 'For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given'. As earworms go, I don't think you can have a better one.

I find it interesting where Isaiah's list of attributes of this promised child lands: And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, **Prince of Peace**

Do take a moment to absorb that verse!

I have to confess to being a bit Grinch-like and not embracing Christmas as enthusiastically as I used to, or as others think I ought. But in my defence, I think it's because all the razzmatazz and activity are, for me, obstacles to focusing on and enjoying the message of peace that my soul craves.

I could quote lots of verses on 'peace' but shall leave it to you to see if you can remember any (or look them up) apart from two:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. John 14:27



Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Matt 5:9

The final one reminds us that peace is not only something to receive but to practice and pass on; many who are meeting family this Christmas may have good opportunity to do just that.

May you be blessed with a renewed acquaintance with peace this Christmas.

UPDATE 2

Preparing for the Cumbria Circuit

Our Implementation Group are working hard to keep the process on track and are now at the stage where we want to step up consultation and engagement with all our congregations and partners across Cumbria. We are building our communications strategy so an Update and a mail chimp post should come out monthly on the first Tuesday. Alongside this we are planning some zoom meetings for a Tuesday evening at 5:00pm for Superintendents in week 2 (from 11th Feb) and all Ministers in week 4 (from 25th Feb).

The Strategy and Vision Group want to give everyone across the new circuit the opportunity to engage in creating a vision for the future up to and beyond Sept 2025. This will include:

- Opportunity to complete and return postcards
- Campfire discussions in January
- Zoom conversations with the implementation group
- A Creative art project

We are hoping to have a first draft of a vision statement ready during February. This isn't the end of the process, but a starter for ongoing consultation. To inform the process, it is hoped that as many people as possible will also attend campfire discussions, but for those who can't, ideas can be written on postcards to ensure we reach more people.

The Group are producing opening worship, and discussion questions, to guide the sessions, intended to last for 1-1.5 hours. Look out for details of where and when your local Campfires are being held. Some will be outside, others inside.

On the 21st November a joint Invitation Committee met and appointed David Newlove as the Superintendent of our new Cumbria Circuit from 1st September 2025.

David is currently a Co-Superintendent of the North Cumbria Circuit. He came to Cumbria from Lincolnshire 6 years ago and has fallen in love with the County. As part of his ministry here he has developed chaplancy roles at the Borderway Auction Mart in Carlisle and at Carlisle Infirmary. Alongside Superintendency David is the Mission Area Lead for Cumbria and a Deputy Chair for the North West England District. As he takes up his new role David will have served as a Superintendent for 26 years.





A number of legal decisions will need to be approved at Church Councils and Circuit Meetings in Feb/March so look out for local dates.

Finally, as we continue to pray for patience and understanding as we develop this exciting initiative, we wish you a peaceful, happy and blessed Christmas.

Perhaps it could be a New Year resolution to take a regular slot on the rota, as it facilitates an important part of PMC's caring nature.







At Christmas time, will you all give a virtual round of applause and join me in saying a huge thank you to the incredible team working here in our Circuit.


We have the most brilliant staff who undertake loads of different roles that all add to the rich tapestry of our expression of being Church.


Restore on the Road 2024–2026 and Beyond...


