Here's a New Year's resolution – be kind to yourself!

Here we are still in January – the first month of a new year. Trace and I were leading some assemblies last week where we considered New Year's resolutions. Did you make any? And if so, how are they going?

At a Minister's meeting I attended last week, we were also encouraged to set goals and plans for the year ahead.

And it's all made me think. Because good intentions can easily end up being something else to make us feel guilty or a failure when we don't make it!



But there is no resolution that, if kept, will make you more worthy of love, and none, that if broken, make you less worthy of love.

Personally, I want to resolve to exercise more – because my 61-year old body seems to be deteriorating right before my eyes. What was girth around my chest has sunk to my stomach. How "wonderfully and fearfully made" can a body be which doesn't do what I want it to do anymore?

And yet John 1 says 'the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth'.

Why would God slip into the vulnerability of being made flesh? It seems a daft idea, given the wasting mortality of our physical lives as humans. Our bodies decay and disappoint us, so why would God choose to have one just like us?

And our human condition also means we never follow through with our good intentions, or keep our resolutions. If that's the human psyche, then why would God open God's-self to take on all of that?

And yet, that's how God became present to us!

So, this week, as we find ourselves failing yet again, and noticing our bodies are not the Adonis or Venus we had hoped for, I invite you to hear the message once more: 'the Word became flesh and lived among us, in this we have seen God's glory'.

Because **that** is a different message entirely to the one we keep telling ourselves.

Because in Jesus we see that our *physical* life is a *spiritual* life. God has blessed our human flesh and our human failings. God came and made God's home with us as a human with a body and a mind just like ours.

And let's remember that our good and imperfect selves are born of God, and even copied by God, and made a home by God. And if the Word became flesh and lived among us - then despite our shame at not being better or different – we are actually beautiful to God, just as we are!

Shape of Sunday Worship at PMC

In response to comments from across our congregation, we are going to trial a slightly different form of worship once a month on Sunday mornings at PMC, for the next 2 or 3 months. Monthly, we will now have one service led by our worship team, with the Minister or Local Preacher delivering the message.

This gives us a broad range of different worship styles being offered. Quarterly, we still hope to offer a Healing service, a service conducted by our Social Justice team, and a more informal café-style service. Then monthly, this new Worship group led service. Other weeks will be our usual mix of both contemporary and more traditional worship.

In addition, we have our monthly Encounter service, held on the last Sunday of each month. There is also a more traditional style of worship at our weekly Circuit service at 10:00 each Tuesday morning.

All of this gives us a range of diverse worship styles to meet the different ways each of us are able to encounter more of God.

It is our desire that PMC is a place where all can experience more of God's love, and are able to worship in ways that enable each of us to praise, worship, and grow in our relationship with God – whilst also respecting the different styles appreciated by others.

We will continue to listen to your feedback on our patterns of worship – as well as all other areas of the mission and ministry of the Church.
