Pull up a Pew

It was pointed out to me at the prayer meeting this week that I have thing about chairs, particularly empty ones at church! I was sharing the thoughts I had following Michael's invitation during Sunday's service to look at the empty chairs – having arrived late we'd snuck in and went upstairs and so had a good view of what in



times past would have been a full congregation. (We regularly sat on the balcony because it was easier than trying to find a place downstairs.)

Generally, I do have a thing about chairs and sofas. I am regularly reminded that I need to curb my desire to fill spaces in our home with comfy seating arrangements. Where does that come from? I don't know - maybe it's an attempt to create a welcome, to make sure there are lots of options for visitors to be comfortable, to enjoy the space and the company.

Michael encouraged us to reflect on our being the body of Christ. I looked at those empty chairs and thought to myself, it's really painful to lose part of the body. And it leaves scars. This will resonate with those who have had surgery of any kind. We were then challenged: 'If we are hurting for those empty seats, for one part of the body no longer present, then let's pray for them.'



I don't know about you but I have found it difficult to know how to broach people's decisions to remain apart from the body at PMC. I felt a wave a guilt looking at those empty chairs. There are people I really should have contacted but I was probably too worried about being seen as judgemental. There is a sense of loss because many have chosen to no longer identify with us at PMC and sadness for not trying harder to keep some relationships going. 1 Corinthians v 27 says 'Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it'. It can take a long time to find a body that we feel we fit with and if a part finds it is no longer able to stay in the body, the whole body is caused to suffer. (see v26).

We are immensely grateful for those in the PMC body who have prayed, sustained, and hurt with us through my cancer journey so far. My ongoing prayers are that together we would be moved to action, be bold in renewing friendships, continue in fellowship and welcome new faces. To use our gifts and service to build the body up, to show Jesus to one another.

Don't get me wrong, bums on seats for sake of numbers is not the goal here, but how good would it be to see every chair filled once again? Dare we pray that we might not have enough and need to get more?

Oh no.... I might now have to resist the temptation to get more seating arrangements in place.

It is a small, ecumenical group who share a passion for reaching out in practical ways to help people in our community – especially the poor or vulnerable.


The Group meets quarterly to pray, review operations, and plan for the future.
